

Be What You Already Are: Unleavened, Part 2 Sunday, May 22, 2016 Dr. Juan M. Moreno

## **TEXT:** 1 Cor. 5:1-13

The Sovereign God uses the Church in the process of progressive sanctification to help **us be** what **we already are** in Christ.

## I. THE FAILURE TO ADDRESS THE FORNICATION IN THE CHURCH: THE TWO-FOLD SIN, 5:1-2.

- A. The Sin of the Man: Incest, 5:1.
  - **1.** This sin was so significant that it was reported to Paul probably by a member of Chloe's household, cf. 1 Cor 1:11.
  - 2. This sin was an ongoing relationship that was prohibited in the Old Testament, cf, Lev. 18:7-8.
- **B.** The Sin of the Congregation: Tolerance, 5:2.
  - 1. The Corinthians applied a perverted theology of grace that resulted in the condoning of sinful behavior.
    - a. The Corinthians "spiritual insight" resulted in a false view of grace.
    - b. For some in Corinth, the grace which brought them to salvation-*with no individual effort of their own* was extended to post-salvation *so that no individual effort is needed*.
  - 2. The Corinthians should have been broken about this man's sin instead of tolerating his publically known sin.

## **II. THE ADMONITION TO CORRECT THE FORNICATION IN THE CHURCH: THE TWO-FOLD COMMAND,** 5:3-8.

- A. The Command to Remove the Incestuous Man from the Fellowship, 5:3-5.
- **B.** The Command to Purge the Fellowship from Sin, 5:6-8.
- **C.** The Clarification to a Previous Command, 5:9-13.
  - **1.** The Corinthians misinterpreted a previous command, 5:9-10.
  - 2. Paul gives the Corinthians the clarification of the command, 5:11.
  - **3.** Paul gives the application of the command, 5:12-13.
    - a. God judges those outside the church membership.
    - b. The church judges those inside its membership.

POINT: The Corinthians were to remove the wicked man from among them!

- **III. APPLICATION**: When dealing with the known sin of others:
  - A. Ask the Lord Jesus to Break Your Heart over Sin and Give You the Boldness to Confront It.
    - 1. Brokeness over the sin of others drives us to pray to God.
    - 2. Boldness to confront the sin of others drives us to speak for God.

## **B.** Emphasize the Grace of God That Not Only Provided a Pardon for Sin, but Also Gives Empowerment Against Sin.
