TEXT: 1 Corinthians 7:25–40

Although in this passage, Paul seems to be agreeing with the slogan, "It is good for a man not to marry," his agreement is more practical in nature than theological.

I. PAUL'S PREFERENCE FOR SINGLENESS, 7:25-35

A. Paul Prefers Singleness Because of an Impending Time of Distress, 7:26-28.

1. What Is this Distress?

- a. It is a present distress (NASB), a present crisis (NIV), an impending crisis (NET), that the Corinthians were facing.
 - (1) Possibly the "present distress" they were experiencing within the community in which many were "weak and sick, and a number have fallen asleep," (1 Cor. 11:30).
 - (2) Possibly the "present distress" that was the common experience of those who believe— the experience of suffering that the church was undergoing.
- b. It is a *distress* the church is not presently experiencing in the United States.

Paul's Point: *In light of the troubles believers are already experiencing, who needs the additional burden of marriage as well?*

2. Why not Marry?

Persecution is difficult for a single person, but multiplied for one who is married.

B. Paul Prefers Singleness Because of the Imminent Return of Christ, 7:29–31.

For Paul, the End Has Already Begun, 7:29-31.

- 1. The Concept of the "Last Days"
 - **a.** An *Imminent* Rapture is one that could occur at any moment, but that might not occur for a long time.
 - **b.** An *Immediate* Rapture is one that is almost certain to happen very soon.
- 2. The Truth About the Last Days
 - **a.** Truth one: We are presently in it, Heb.1:1-2; 9:26; 1 Cor 10:11.
 - **b. Truth two: We are presently experiencing it**, 1 Tim. 4:1-2; 2 Tim. 3:1-5; 1 John 2:18.
- C. Paul Prefers Singleness Because of the Opportunity for Undistracted Service for Christ, 7:32–35.
