TEXT: 1 Corinthians 11:17-34

I. THE DISHONORING OF THE LORD'S TABLE (11:17-22)

The Corinthians did not fail to gather as a body & to gather for the purpose of commemorating the Lord's Supper. Their problem was their failure to recognize the "oneness" in God's body when they assembled. In the church, there was to be neither Jew nor Greek, slave nor free, rich nor poor. The gathering at Corinth around the Lord's Supper was marred by the "haves" humiliating the "have nots" in the *Common Meal* that preceded the Lord's Supper.

- A. The Rich Were Shaming the Poor at The Common Meal (Love Feast) that Preceded the Lord's Supper (11:18, 22).
 - **1.** The Nature of the Gathering—A Common Meal was associated with the "Coming Together" (Acts 2:42, 46; 20:7, 11; Jude 1:12).
 - **2.** The Nature of the Church—The Common Meal was a way to emphasize that believers in the church were to have all things in common (Acts 2:43-47).
 - 3. The Nature of the Time- Roman Corinth was a class-conscious society.
- B. The Rich Were Not Waiting for the Poor When it Came to the Common Meal (11:33).

When was the Common Meal eaten?

- 1. Before the Lord's Supper
- 2. In Conjunction with the Lord's Supper (11:25)

II. THE DESIGN OF THE LORD'S TABLE (11:23-26)

The Lord's table is a memorial of the cross work of Jesus Christ which secured our salvation.

- A. The Lord's Supper is a Memorial (11:24-25).
- **B.** The Lord's Table is a Symbol (11:24).
 - 1. Communion is a Symbol of Christ's Substitutionary Death.
 - 2. Communion is a Symbol of Christ's Atoning Death.
- C. The Lord's Supper is a Prophecy of the Final Gathering of the Saints (11:26).

III. THE DISCERNMENT IN THE LORD'S TABLE (11:27-33)

- A. Discernment in Communion is Essential Because of Liability Involved (11:27, 29-30)
- **B.** Discernment in Communion Requires Self-examination (11:28, 31-32)
